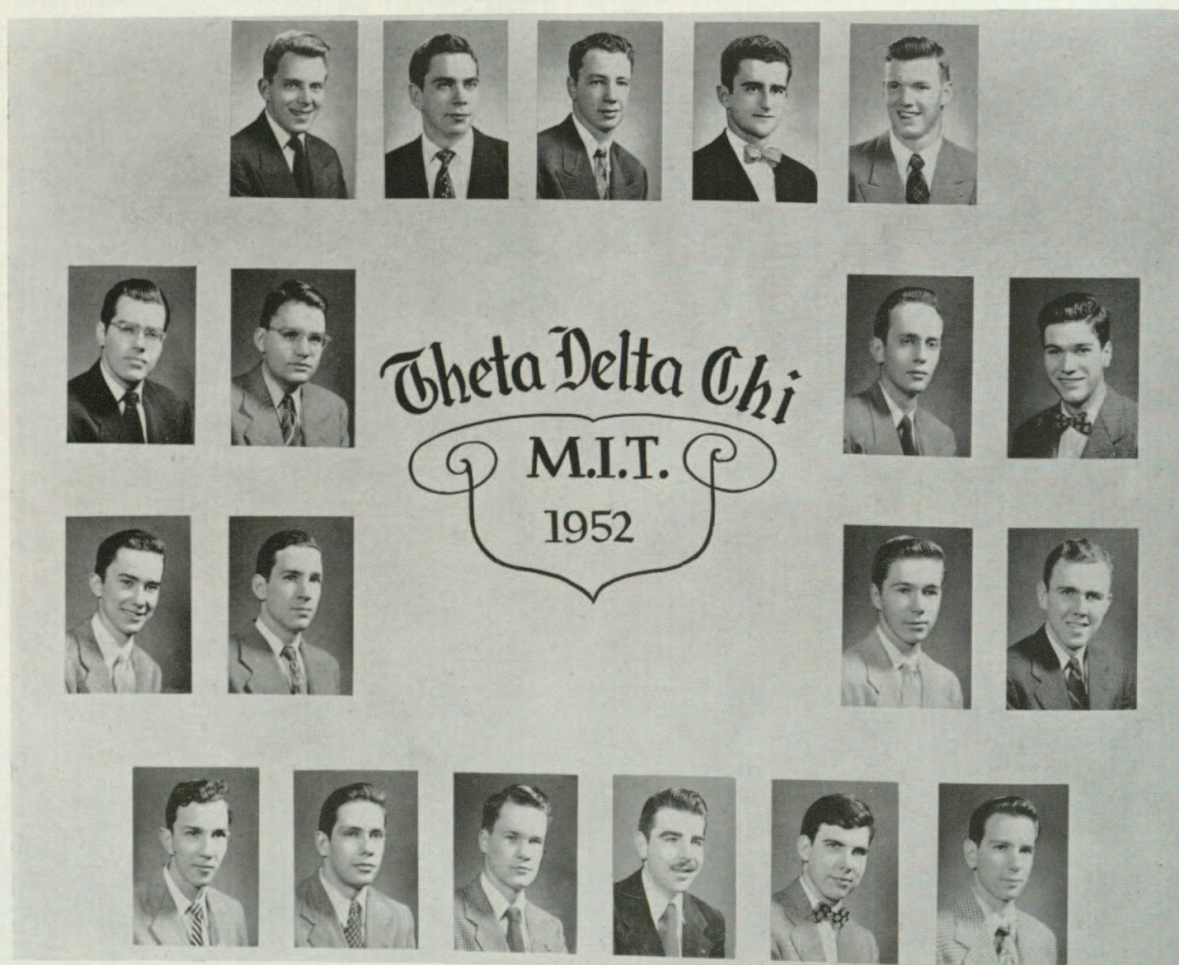

Our departing seniors leave behind an admirable list of activities. There were two men on the *Voo Doo* senior board, one man on the sailing team, and two captains of Tech's track and basketball teams.
